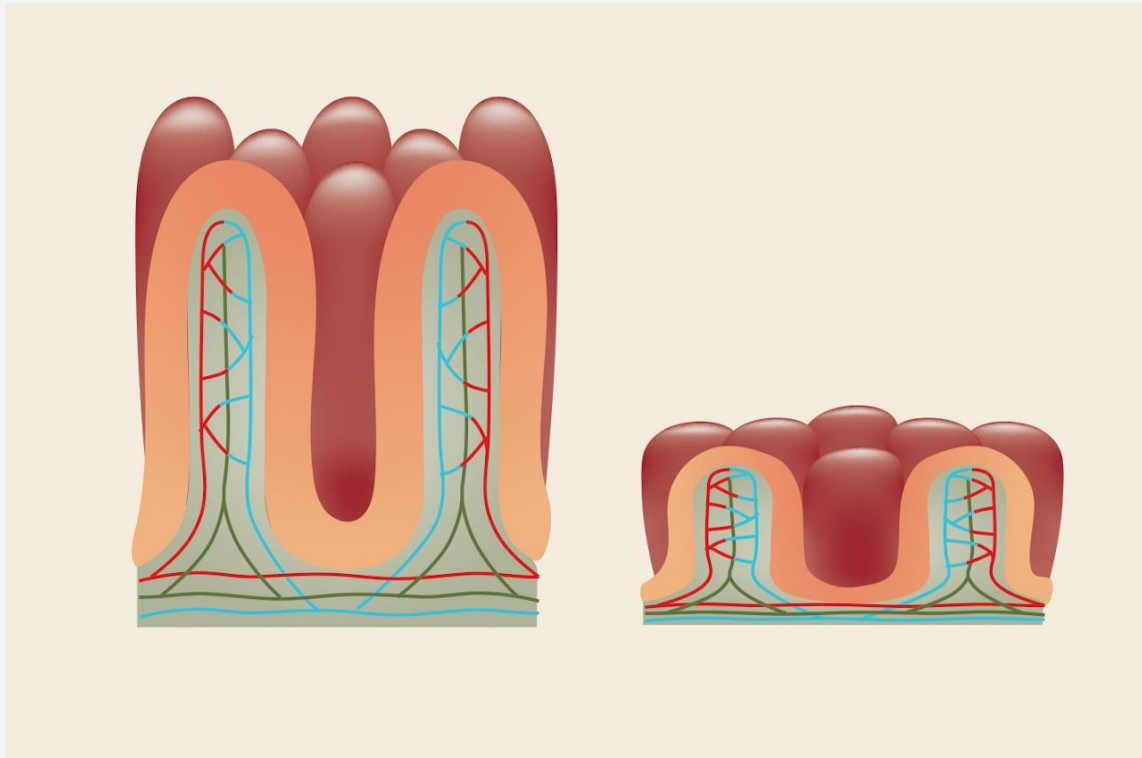


Mistakes in refractory coeliac disease and how to avoid them



Umberto Volta, Giacomo Caio and Roberto De Giorgio discuss refractory coeliac disease (RCD), which is characterized by persistent or recurrent symptoms and signs after >12 months adhering to a strict gluten-free diet (GFD). They stress the need for correct diagnosis and provide algorithms summarizing the diagnostic process for RCD type 1 and 2 and evaluation of persistent villous atrophy in initially seronegative coeliac disease patients on a GFD.

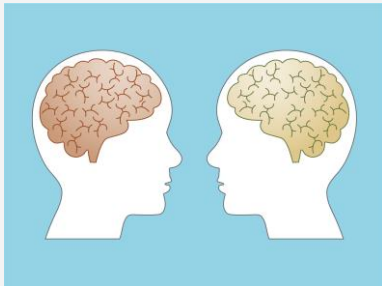
